VII. Unfinished Business

a. Fundraiser Summary

- i. Pick up went well
 - 1. We ordered 412+15 extra
 - 2. Total units this year was 427. Last year was 499 units.
 - 3. \$13,380 this year total sales. \$11,380 total sales last year
 - 4. Profit this year was \$2741
 - 5. Next year could we do pick ups in the canteen to make sure the gym is ready for school the next day.

VIII. New Business

a. Shrove Tuesday

- i. No school on shrove Tuesday
- ii. We can do it on another day. We are thinking of February 17th (Friday)
- iii. Kayla is willing and council would like her to
 - 1. Parent volunteers are welcome. There will be something to do but there is no pressure for specific numbers.
 - 2. We will seek donations this year for the food.
 - a. Requests should go out early January. Avoid whole wheat pancakes if they ask (they stick).
 - b. Donation letter templates will be added to group chat.

b. Caretaking/Cleaning Concerns

- i. Asheley had a concerned parent call regarding the cleanliness of the school. During the outbreak there was no sanitizer at the doors.
 - 1. We have now filled the hand sanitizers
 - 2. The school is currently dirty. The factors contributing to this are:
 - a. Budget required the division to cut 2 caretakers.
 - b. There are no relief caretakers. If a caretaker calls in sick there is no one coming. If there is no one at other schools the caretakers we do have can be pulled to other schools and no one replaces them.
 - c. There are caretaker positions available. They are having trouble filling the position.
 - d. The division is considering private contractors as a short-term solution.
 - e. We only have one caretaker in the evening.

- f. There will be some decisions to be made next year regarding the cleanliness of the school. If we have concerns, we can voice them to Linda & Greg or we can send letters to Greg and he will direct them to the superintendent.
- g. The teachers have been trying to supplement but it is tricky as there is just not the time.
- h. The point was made about wellness
 - i. Teachers' wellness they are cleaning which may cause them to fall ill
 - ii. Student wellness they are in an outbreak scenario but their environment is not clean
 - iii. Custodial staff could burn out as there is too little resources and too much work

c. Rent to Own Tech

- i. Sen Joyce Fairbairn School does a rent to own program. Have we considered this?
 - 1. We did this a few years ago. It was not successful as the division had a bunch of issues. Collection issues, parental controls, they could source it cheaper etc...
 - 2. Tech issues
 - a. \$500,000 approved from board for tech
 - b. 3 to 1 issue
 - c. Going forward more devices will be 5 years old and they will be removed so once again we will have a shortage

d. Ski Trip Support

- i. Need support getting volunteers and help coordinating the plan. Grades 4-9 – need 1 adult per 8 kids that attend. Need to be a qualified volunteer, can confidently ski or snow board, criminal record check, vulnerable sector check. Some time in March. VS check takes about 6 weeks to complete. Approx 125 kids attend – need 20 or so adults.
 - 1. Steve & Greg are hoping to get some leniency on the ratios as there should be enough supervision from hill staff to make this happen.
 - 2. Greg does not need us to help plan or coordinate but we can help support them by putting out a call for volunteers. Once we get more information Greg will let us know what we are actually looking for.

i. Was played on screen in the gym

f. Where are sports fees directed

i. Greg will follow up with Joel. Generally, reffing, tournament fees, equipment, and other cost etc.

g. Bell times

- i. Door open at 8:45
 - 1. What temp does the doors open early

- a. Guide of -15ish (or when it feels cold) doors will open earlier
- b. There has not been an abundance of kids here before 8:45
- c. Door will continue to stay locked for security. The doors being unlocked during the day caused a variety of security issues
- d. Unlocking the doors early in the morning requires more supervision from the teachers and there is not always enough hours for the teachers.
- e. Early education what are the roles, rights and responsibilities of the parents of theses young kids
 - i. There was a shift to there needing to be a reason before parents could enter the school. This is in some ways still the case.
 - Perhaps there could be an early education orientation day that provides some guidance on what is allowed.
 - 1. Greg will take it to the teachers to find some solutions to these issues. (ie a Mom and newborn waiting outside for their child, or children needing help with snowsuits, etc...)
- f. Guidelines for parents entering the school
 - i. We as parents would like more information about what we can and cannot do in the schools
 - ii. We would hope to see a return to the community feel that the school used to have
 - iii. Greg will work to communicate the guidelines better. He has seen more parents in the school than last year.
 - iv. Doors are unlocked at peak times

h. Fundraising

i. Capital Projects – we have the ability to save for capital projects. There is a way to do it. Section 13.2 & 14.1 of the Alberta Regulations talks about how to make this happen. We will have to involve our finance department to understand how to make it happen. There is both a contingency and a capital improvement option available. Greg will review this and we will discuss again in future.
