Now that we are well into the school year, marks are getting established.
If you have concerns about your child's mark(s), please book an interview with the subject teacher.
Elementary Report cards will be sent home March 17.
Junior High will not receive report cards. The most up to date Marks can be accessed on PowerSchool.

Please note, if the teacher you are wanting to see is booked up or you are not able to make the available times, please email the teacher directly to make alternate arrangements.

## How to talk to your kid(s) about report cards

Here's how to handle the A's and the D's (and everything in between).
DO stay positive. Find something to praise, even if it's only to comment on the slight improvement in your child's English mark or how well she gets along with her classmates.

DON'T compare. Avoid the temptation to talk about a sister's, or cousin's or friend's report card.
DO listen to the key player. Ask your children what they thinks about their report card, what they are most proud of, or disappointed in, and why they think they received the marks they did. Remember to keep calm, cool and collected - this is a conversation, not an interrogation.

DO prepare a follow-up plan. Take time on report card day to focus on and celebrate successes. Then begin fresh the next day with plans for improvement. Ask your children what they think they need to do, both at home and at school, to get better marks. Report cards sometimes reflect a lack of effort more than a lack of skill, so maybe they need to limit screen time or cut back on extracurricular activities. Offer your own suggestions and then, together, set small, realistic goals. You may also want to talk to your children's teachers about what your child can do to bring up there grades, especially if they're not reflective of the time and effort that is being putting in.

## What is good attendance?

Going to school on time, every day for the full day, is important. Consistent attendance will help children do well in school, college, and work. Good attendance is missing not more than 1 day of school a month, whether excused or unexcused. Arriving on time to school and staying for the full day is extremely beneficial for students as often the most important things of the day are discussed first thing in the morning or at the end of the day before students leave.

## Why is good attendance important?

When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects. Regular attendance ensures that:

- Preschoolers build skills and develop good habits for showing up on time
- Elementary students read well by the end of 3rd grade


SCHOOL+YOU = SUCCESS

- Middle \& high schoolers stay on track for graduation


## How many absences are too many?

Too many absences-excused or unexcused-can keep students from succeeding in school and in life. Students who miss more than 1 school day a month become at risk. For example:

- Half the students who miss two to four days in September go on to miss nearly one month of school;
- Chronically absent (2 days a month) students are more likely to drop out of high school;
- Chronically absent kindergartners score 20 percent lower in reading and math in later grades;
- Student absences in grade 8 are 8 can be foretelling of grade 9 course failure than test scores;
Chronic absenteeism in grade 6 is the strongest predictor of not graduating from high school.
