The Lethbridge competitors ranged in age 15-63 years old. The events contained five-pin bowling, curling, figure skating, and floor hockey. The Lethbridge team took home eight medals, three which were gold. Gold for Figure Skating - Moriah, Gold for Women's 5-Pin Bowling -Rika, Gold for Men's 5-Pin Bowling – Kyle, Silver for Men's 5-Pin Bowling – Blaine, Silver for Men's 5-Pin Bowling -Steven. Team Alberta will play at the National Game in 2024 and others who are successful have the opportunity to be a part of Team Canada at the World Games.

Volleyball Then and Now

Volleyball has changed a lot during the years. It was first invented in 1895 by William G. Morgan. Volleyball is now in the top five largest international sporting federations in the world. Back when it first became a sport, it was named "Mintonette" by William G. Morgan. The uniforms typically were a t-shirt, baggy shorts and sneakers. Knee pads were not usually worn, and didn't become common until the 1990s.

It hasn't changed much since it became a sport besides the points changing from 21 to 25 for each match. Now uniforms are way nicer and there are teams for almost every country around the world. The top men's team in the world currently are Poland in first with Italy, France, Brazil, and Russia following close behind. For the women's teams Serbia is in first with Italy, Brazil, the US, and China following behind.

Over time the volleyball courts have changed from 25 ft by 50 ft to 18m by 9m. Since 1895 when the sport was first created, rules have changed a lot. The number of players on the court has changed from any amount, to only six players on the court now. The amount of sets has changed from nine to five sets. The amount of attempts to serve the ball initially was two tries back then, so if you missed a serve you could get the chance to serve again. During the 1930s and 1940s the distinct ways of contacting the ball like passing setting and hitting techniques were first recognized.

The earthquake in Turkey on February 6th, was so big it registered as 7.8 magnitude, classifying it as major on the Richter scale. The death toll has reached 41 000 people and is still rising. There have been 120 000 people injured and at least 90 billion dollars worth of damage. Over 24 million people have been affected by this earthquake, 200 000 buildings have been destroyed and 2.4 million people have been displaced from their homes. The Heartbreaking Reality of Residential Schools

Residential Schools were very sad places. They were responsible for years of abuse and trauma. Residential schools started in the 17 th century, and were open until the late 1990s. The building itself was usually a brick building. Inside looked like a normal school only First-Nations Peoples were sent there because the government wanted to wipe out First-Nations Peoples and their culture, but they failed.


In Residential Schools, children experienced all sorts of abuse. Survivors say they have been beaten and strapped. Some students were shackled to their beds, some had needles shoved in their tongues for speaking their native languages. Survivors say Indigenous children even had to sleep in their urine, if they accidentally wet their bed. These are just some of the horrible abuses, along with overcrowding and many others.

Today, 4130 bodies of children who died in Residential Schools have been found. A total of 3200 bodies were found just in BC alone. Nowadays, we don't have Residential Schools because they had and continue to have such negative effects on *I* the lives of many families and communities. The majority of residential schools were torn down by the department of Indian Affairs and there are very few remaining buildings today.

There are some ways we can help the First-Nation people heal from this tragedy. Educating people is the first step. If we can talk about it, we can gather together people who went to Residential Schools, they can express their feelings to each other, educating people about this terrible tragedy.
