This is an Alberta Emergency Alert issued by the AEMA. This alert is in effect for AB. Extreme cold resulting in high power demand has placed the Alberta grid at a high risk of rotating power outages this evening. Albertans are asked to immediately limit their electricity use to essential needs only. Turn off unnecessary lights and electrical appliances. Minimize the use of space heaters. Delay use of major power appliances. Delay charging electrical vehicles and plugging in block heaters. Cook with microwave instead of stove. On the 15th of January, 2024, a grid alert was issued by the Alberta Emergency Management Agency (AEMA) in effect for all of Alberta, the fourth one in a row. The Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) stated on Twitter, now dubbed 'X' through a tweet that the alerts were due to extreme cold and high risks of power facilities outages. However, it ended about an hour later.

Over the weekend, alerts from the province and the AESO, told Albertans to save power to prevent a power outage. Extreme power demands caused a lot of pressure to fall on the electricity grid. This is why they issued Albertans to save power by only using necessary devices to avoid a blackout.

It is the highest power demand Alberta has ever seen, with a record-breaking 12,383 megawatts consumed on Thursday, January 11th, 2024. Despite the challenges, Albertans responded well to the alert, reducing their electricity usage, and Saskatchewan also provided support. As the province reaches much lower temperatures than expected consecutively, we need to be sensitive about our power consumption. So far, everything has been taken care of thanks to solar and wind power.

Megawatt: a unit of power equal to one million watts, especially as a measure of the output of a power station.

Rising Waters: How Our School Faced Flooding

On Friday, January 12th, 2024 and Monday, January 15th, 2024, school at FLVT was canceled, due to a cracked pipe that burst. The pipe was located down the portable wing of FLVT, past the office. According to a message that was emailed to parents and guardians of FLVT students by superintendent of Holy Spirit Catholic Schools, Mr. Ken Sampson, the pipe carrying clean, fresh water burst around 6:00 AM, and did not stand for more than two hours.

"I was worried about the classrooms near the leak and the damage that would happen to the classrooms down that hallway", Ms. Tkach commented, concerningly. "I know that lots of students were probably happy to be home and warm during the extremely cold weather, but I think we need to acknowledge the hard work that was done by caretaking staff, administrators and all others to clean up the mess."

"I felt like it should have lasted for a month so I could relax instead of going to school," Brooke from 7J, stated clearly appreciating the extra time off surrounding the holidays.

Mr. Pollio commented that the pipe burst was "wet, real wet". The ruptured pipe caused a significant mess that led to fans needing to be on to dry the water and minimize the damage. ServiceMasters was called in to help clean the mess and safety of the school was examined over the days the school was closed to ensure a successful reopening of the school.


Extreme cold weather can cause water to freeze, and when water freezes it expands. This can put extra pressure on pipes in any facility or home, potentially causing pipes to rupture. FLVT was not the only school or facility that experienced pipes bursting or flooding during the cold weather. Other buildings impacted by similar events include Chinook High School, where a fire sprinkler line burst, resulting in flooding, St. Catherine's School in Picture Butte, with a water main break, City Hall, Servus Sport Centre, and others.

The message of FLVT's school cancellation was shared on the school's various social media. Many students reported feeling feelings of joy, satisfaction and ultimate happiness when school on Monday, January 15th 2024 was canceled. Others worried about the cancellation of sports, extra curricular activities, and the disruption towards learning activities. Many teachers indicated worry about being off track for their learning goals for the year, especially with junior high midterms quickly approaching.

The flooding event at FLVT may serve as a reminder that extreme cold weather can serve as a danger not only to those who spend time outside, but also the buildings that we rely on each day. The school is back and running as usual, however the ceiling around the affected area remains exposed.

Lethbridge's Cold Snap

A cold snap refers to an extended period of icy weather during winter. This is a common occurrence in the city due to its location in southern Alberta, where cold arctic air from the north can easily move in and create frigid temperatures.

A cold snap is typically characterized by temperatures dropping well below freezing, with average lows reaching between -15 to -20 degrees Celsius. However, temperatures can often plummet even lower, with wind chills making it feel even colder.

During a cold snap, the city of Lethbridge often experiences icy conditions, heavy snowfall, and strong winds, which can make it difficult to travel and can lead to dangerous road conditions. As a result, schools and businesses may close from excess snow making travel difficult or unsafe or pipe bursting, and transportation services may be disrupted.

According to a Global News report, Co-founder of Streets Alive Mission Ken Kissick said, "Today [January 10, 2024], instead of closing like we normally do ... We stayed open. We gave the soup kitchen a heads up and we provided some soup."

During extremely cold weather, a common struggle is vehicles not starting or getting stuck in the snow. "Don't even have time to think, don't even have time to put calls into the computer and I got to answer it otherwise, it just won't stop ringing," said Corey Hebel, general manager of Oil Country Towing in another Global News report while commenting about increases in requests for towing.

Extremely cold weather can also have a major impact on the city's residents, as it can be particularly harsh for those who are homeless or do not have access to adequate shelter. In some cases, it can even lead to power outages as the extreme temperatures put a strain on the city's electrical grid.

Residents of Lethbridge need to take precautions during a cold snap, such as dressing in warm layers, staying indoors as much as possible, and avoiding unnecessary travel. The city also implements measures to keep roads and sidewalks clear of snow and ice to ensure the safety of its residents.

Despite its challenges, cold weather in Lethbridge is a regular occurrence and is just one of the many unique aspects of living in this prairie city.

On January 1st, at 16:10 (Japan Standard Time), a magnitude 7.6 earthquake struck 7 km north-northwest of Suza, located on the Noto Peninsula of Ishikawa Prefecture, Japan. Then on January 9th another earthquake occurred off the west coast of Honshu at around 17:59, at a magnitude of 5.8. The death toll rises up to 161. Efforts continue to find people who went missing because of the earthquake. The bad weather is hampering rescues with not only heavy rain but also snow triggering warnings of landslides and building collapses. The earthquake also caused a major fire on top of toppling buildings. Those in the worst-affected areas are being urged to keep their guard up as they continue to experience further quakes.

indisputable advantage, granting him an indisputable upper hand.




DEMON SLAYER (Rengoku vs.






