
What Would You Do With a Snow Day?

Only One Take

Have you ever heard the song *Somewhere Over the Rainbow*, sometimes referred to as *What a Wonderful World*? Can you believe it was performed in just one take? This amazing feat was done by a famous musician named IZ.

Born in Honolulu, Hawaii, on May 20, 1959, Israel Kamakawiwo'ole, [kama-ka-vi-vo-lay] sometimes known as IZ, was a singer and composer from Hawaii.

In 1989, IZ called Milan Bertosa, a musical producer, at 3 in the morning . He arrived 15 minutes later to meet with Bertosa. "After setting up some microphones and doing a brief sound check, I roll the tape, and he starts off with *Somewhere Over the Rainbow*. In a single take, he performs both singing and playing," Bertosa said, recalling IZ singing "Somewhere Over the Rainbow ," in one take!

Sadly IZ succumbed to respiratory failure and other illnesses; he died in 1997 at the age of 36. He stated, "because we are Hawaiians, we live in both worlds. When our time comes, don't cry for me." He is often regarded for advocating for Hawaiian rights, and talking about the displacement of native Hawaiians.

In 2020, *Somewhere Over the Rainbow* was selected for preservation in the United States National Recording Registry by the Library of Congress as being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant".

This new and burgeoning song continues to soar in popularity since its sudden surge in plays across music and media platforms. The song held the 1st place for a few weeks and is still gaining plays.

Taylor Swift's re-recorded albums under the tag of "(Taylor's version)" (including Fearless, 1989, Red, and Speak Now) have blown up recently, but one specific song from 1989 has gone viral. "Is It Over Now? (Taylor's Version) [From The Vault]" has earned the 2nd placement on the Billboard chart. This song held the 1st place for about a week.

Taylor Swift's track, "Cruel Summer," not only remains deeply embedded in many people's minds, but has also dominated various social media platforms. It has secured the number 3 position on the Billboard chart for over 4 weeks, remained on the chart for 28 weeks, and has gained approximately 1 billion plays. Although originally released in 2019 in her album "Lover," it was re-released as a single in 2023 due to the rise in popularity since the "Eras Tour." This song held the 1st place for about a week.

Drake's track, "First Person Shooter" (featuring J. Cole), has been given the 3rd placement on the Billboard. This song has also spread quite a lot in social media culture. It held the 1st placement for less than a week.

Drake's track, "Slime You Out" (featuring SZA), got the 4th placement on the chart. This is the 12th hit that was a single for Drake, and the 2nd for SZA. Drake also grows his record for the most top-5, top-10, and top-40 hits. The collaboration is featured on Drake's album "For All the Dogs." This song held the 1st place for more than a week.



What would you choose to be the best sport?




What country would you most want to visit? These are the top 4 picks of people in our school. Would you like to go to one of these 4 or would you pick something different?






