
May God grant us the wisdom, courage, and strength to fulfill our sacred duty with courage and love, knowing that He walks alongside us every step of the way.







#### **PARENTS AND STUDENTS OF HOLY SPIRIT SCHOOL DISTRICT**

You and your families are invited to join us on this special day to walk in a procession as we bring the Holy Eucharist to the streets of Lethbridge.

This is a great way for the children and their families to profess their faith and belief in the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. For many of us our memories of the special times in our church life are what helps keep our gift of faith during the times when we find it challenging. This is one of those occasions and this is our wish for you.

**It is suggested that we wear white, or red** (second choice) which represents the Body or the Blood of Christ. **School students are invited to wear any clothing that represents their CATHOLIC schools.** Younger children and Elementary school age children must be accompanied by a parent(s).

The procession is a reverent and respectful procession with joyful song and prayer as we process with the Monstrance we show our adoration for the Body of Christ in the Eucharist.

We leave from St. Basil's at 12 noon, after the 11:00 am Mass. The Eucharist is placed in the Monstrance, and then on the carrier. Those wishing to walk follow the procession moving south on 13<sup>th</sup> Street with a prayer stop at the corner of 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue before continuing to CCH. You are invited to take turns carrying the carrier.

At Our Lady of Assumption procession begins with a prayer service at 11:45 am. Once the Monstrance is on the carrier we walk east to Mayor Magrath Drive, where we turn north. After a prayer stop at 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue we continue walking along Mayor Magrath to 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue, then we turn left and continue walking to 20<sup>th</sup> Street. We turn right at Ecole St. Mary's and continue until we reach CCH field.

You are invited to walk with us all the way (with the prayer stop it will take about 1 hour), or join us at one of the prayer stations. If you cannot walk join us at Catholic Central High School, East campus on the field.

At CCH we will have Benediction on the field, weather permitting. In bad weather we will gather in the cafeteria. This will be followed by a social lunch and a soccer game with Father Santiago (weather permitting).

***There are three major processions in the life of the church, including Corpus Christi: the Sunday after Trinity Sunday when we remember the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, Holy Thursday. A prominent aspect of this feast is the procession which is to follow the Mass... The procession should be seen as a public declaration of the parish community's faith..... Processions are a very important part of our Catholic identity. We are a pilgrim people on a journey, a journey of growth in faith and self-awareness. We are called to be followers of Jesus, to walk with Him.***



## What is Off Campus Programming?

It is a way for students to earn high school credit away from campus through five different programs.

# OFF CAMPUS PROGRAMS

### Work Experience

#### Work Experience

The WEP is an opportunity for students to develop employability skills while completing high school credits. Students work at an approved work site part time or during the summer.

Students work with employers and receive one credit for every 25 hours of work. Students may work any day, Monday through Sunday. Transportation is the students' responsibility.

#### Dual Credit

Holy Spirit students have an opportunity to earn post secondary credit as well as high school credit by enrolling into one of the many offered post secondary dual credit courses.

### RAP

#### Registered Apprenticeship Program

RAP is an opportunity for high school students to earn up to 40 credits towards their high school diploma while counting hours towards their first year apprenticeship in one of Alberta's trades.

The students who have made career choices and commitments to RAP begin their training in any one of the apprenticeship trades while in high school. They spend part of the year in school completing graduation requirements and part in industry as a registered apprentice.

### Green Certificate

#### Green Certificate

The Green Certificate Program is an apprenticeship - style program that allows students, who live and work in agriculture, the opportunity to earn credits toward their high school diploma.

Students will have the opportunity to obtain an industry recognized certificate from Alberta Agriculture. Students learn on the job, under the direction of experienced farm personnel and under the supervision and administration of Alberta Agriculture, Forestry (AF), and Alberta Education.

#### Special Projects

Special Project students become involved in supervised selection, planning, and organization of their own programs which is NOT within the scope of the regular curriculum. Students can earn up to 15 credits.
