## **HURRICANE MASSACRES EASTERN CANADA**

Near the end of September, one of the largest hurricanes we have had in Canada hit the east coast, leaving a trail of destruction.

Hurricane Fiona made landfall in Nova Scotia on September 24th. At least 17 people have died, and many more people are still missing. A total of 12 500 people had to evacuate the province and over 20 buildings were destroyed. The hurricane had wind speeds reading up to 209 kilometers an hour, and a flooding depth of 6.1 metres. The total precipitation was at least 889 mm.

Fiona was downgraded from a

hurricane to a tropical storm on September 23rd, but it destroyed people's homes, leaving many people without a place to live, or displaced from their home. Thousands of people were without proper power or even water. "Our thoughts are with all Canadians affected by Hurricane Fiona, as well as with the first responders and volunteers who are working tirelessly to help those in need," Blair, minister of said Bill emergency preparedness. government has made a program for donations for the Red Cross to help with hurricane relief.

Peter Paul Rubens was born in Siegen (Holy Roman Empire, now Germany) in 1577 and died in Antwerp (Spanish Netherlands, now Belgium) in 1640.

Rubens carried out negotiating tasks in the context of the Eighty Years' War (1568-1648). He played an important role in the settlement of peace between England and Spain in 1630.

Rubens' style emphasized the strength and vitality of the human body, as well as a sense of movement that he achieved through curved lines. He also contributed to Catholic art. One of his most important religious pieces is called *The Elevation of the Cross*.

The rules are quite simple, but gameplay is fast and adrenaline inducing.
