






Riding the bus this year?

Just a few reminders of school bus regulations:

- Parents/Guardians must be at their child's bus stop if they are in Kindergarten Grade 1 for both
 drop off and pick up unless they are with an older sibling. If a parent/guardian is not at the Bus
 Stop, the child will be taken back to the school and it will be the school's responsibility to contact
 the parent.
- Students must be at their designated Bus Stop at least five minutes before their pick time. We are
 unable to stop and wait for students due to the timing and the amount of students transported, if
 students are not at a bus stop and visible to the school bus operator they will continue on to the
 next designated Bus Stop.
- Friends may not take the bus for play dates, to daycare, to grandparents, etc.
- Please do not to park in the School Bus Parking Zones.





Our school bus transportation, Southland Transportation Ltd., uses an GPS tracking service app called "MyBusStop." The program delivers real-time information about a subscriber's bus location, route stops and schedules, as well as traffic, route progress and possible delays.

To activate your account:

- 1. Download the app by searching for "MyBusStop," or visit the website (www.mybusstop.ca).
- Use a web browser when first registering or making any changes to your account preferences. These changes cannot be made within the app itself.
- 2. Get your School's Bus Code & Register
- 3. Choose your Route & Stop.
- 4. Start tracking!

The app is user friendly and simple to use for people of all ages. It is responsive, provides seamless onscreen navigation, and allows users to zoom in, tap and scroll. Real-time updates are included and users can receive frequent bus updates about traffic conditions and dispatch comments. The clean interface highlights the most important information at your fingertips. MyBusStop is low data, and offers full functionality with minimal data consumption.

The "My School Bus Monitor" website also gives you the opportunity to search for school bus route delays, and includes an option to sign up for email alerts. Simply search for the school you are looking for to see if any delays are being reported.

Personally Owned Electronic Devices

Personally Owned Electronic Devices (POEDs)

are not to be operated by students during regularly scheduled instructional time unless such use is approved by the classroom teacher to facilitate learning activities.

Clarity on Cell Phone Procedure:

- 1. Mobile phones should be "off and away" during class times.
- -If a student brings their phone to school, it needs to be stored in their lockers. Please make sure your child has a lock that they feel comfortable opening with ease. We will not be responsible for devices that are left in unlocked lockers.

<u>Please note:</u> If a cellular phone is seen or heard in class, the student will be asked to take their device to the office.

- 2. Smartwatches will need to be silenced and in watch mode only when worn to school.
- 3. Delivered devices will be returned to students at the end of the day in the first and second instances. Should there be a third occurrence, a call will be made home requiring a parent/guardian to collect the child's device.
- 4. Students are still able to access their devices prior to school, during breaks and after school. Parents/ guardians should know to contact their child during these times if needed.







- St. Teresa of Avila


St. Teresa of Avila 1515-1582 (Feast Day: October 15)

St. Teresa of Avila, also known as as St. Teresa of Jesus, is a saint and Doctor of the Church well known for her mysticism and writings on prayer. Born in the 1500s, her family was quite wealthy and religious; her and her younger brother even ran away in their youth seeking to be martyrs. Her medieval world was filled with tales of knights and religious education in her youth. At the age of 20, she entered a Carmelite convent and began reading more deeply about prayer, including reading from St. Augustine's Confessions. She began to have visions, to levitate, and to seek solitude, contemplation, and a more austere lifestyle. This led her to establish a new convent which followed more strict rules to encourage deeper piety. Aside from her time in prayer and writing, she spent much of her later life traveling to establish these reformed convents. She died in October 1582. As of August 2024, researchers and scientists have found that her body remains incorrupt.

St. Teresa is famous for her writings on prayer. Two of her well-known texts are The Way of Perfection and The Interior Castle. In The Way of Perfection, St. Teresa outlines four essential stages to prayer - devotion of the heart, peace, union, and ecstasy - using the analogy of a garden. The Interior Castle describes seven mansions (rooms or steps) which draw us closer to God. The rooms lead from active prayer to contemplation to mystical union with God. These works have heavily influenced many other Catholic saints and theologians, which led to her being named a Doctor of the Church in 1970. She is often depicted with a guill, representing her writing, and the dove, representing the influence of the Holy Spirit.

The Apostles' Creed

"I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth..."



What do we profess about God when we proclaim the Apostles' Creed?

- We proclaim our belief in one God in contrast to a belief in no God or many Gods - as a matter of faith.
- We speak of our relationship with God using the analogy of Father, using the same language that Jesus did in speaking with God and in teaching us the 'Our Father." Jesus called God 'Abba' - a loving parental term to convey the intimacy of God with humanity. Our God is not an impersonal force or distant being.

- We proclaim our belief in one God in contrast to a belief in no God or many Gods - as a matter of faith.
- We profess our God as Almighty this word appears 56 times in scripture; it is used only for God with the literal meaning as 'the One who has his hand on everything.' All power and authority on earth derives from God, and God remains unchanging, eternal, and reliable. All things are possible with God.
- We understand that God is the creator of both our physical world and the spiritual realm. While we live in a created world that God constantly tends, in order to reach our full potential we seek relationship with the God who loves us. We are surrounded by the presence of God, who wants us to be here.

As we seek to become Pilgrims of Hope this year, let us contemplate the Creed, and how our proclamation of the Creed unites us to one another and to all Christians through time and space.

"Proclaiming" In Our Schools

For the first time, this year Catholic Education Week will be combined into one celebration with Catholic Education Sunday. From October 19-25, we will join with the rest of our provincial counterparts under the theme Testify! Share the Reason for Your Hope. This theme connects well to our own Faith Plan call to Proclaim! Each day, look for liturgies and videos that will be shared that explore aspects of the theme, and join in praying the Angelus at noon. The Angelus is an ancient prayer recalling the events of the Annunciation, when the angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would conceive by the Holy Spirit and become the mother of God. The prayer honours Mary's great 'yes' to God; offered humbly, faithfully and obediently. Through this prayer we reflect upon and celebrate the great mystery of God sharing in our humanity, becoming one of us in the person of Jesus. This is a great opportunity to echo Mary's 'yes', and to proclaim our faith together!

For a shared mission - We pray that the Church continue to sustain in all ways a Synodal lifestyle, as a sign of co-responsibility, promoting the participation, the communion and the mission shared among priests, religious and lay people.
